HOME LEARNING PROCEDURES - Remote learning support

When will my child need to learn from home?

- If your child has to self-isolate because of coronavirus and is well enough to work*
- If there is a local lockdown and the school is advised to partially close or your child has to shield

*If your child is unwell, they should focus on their recovery and we will support them once they are well enough to complete essential work that has been missed.

What is my child expected to do?

We are determined to keep all of our pupils on track this year and make sure no one falls behind if they need to learn from home because of coronavirus.

We want to make sure your child can learn as much as possible at home. The following guidelines cover our expectations of what we would like your child to do whilst learning remotely, and how we plan to support both you and your child/children.

What support will the school provide?

- Parents will be able to contact teachers via telephone/email
- Teachers will provide feedback on work produced so that your child knows how they are doing and is clear about their next steps
- If pupils do not have access to a laptop or tablet, teachers will provide paper copies of learning packs and feedback via telephone/email

What can I do to help my child?

Create a positive environment for your child to learn at home, for example:

- Distinguish between weekdays and weekends, to separate school life and home life
- Designate a working space if possible, and at the end of the day have a clear cutoff to signal school time is over
- Encourage your child to work independently
- Create and stick to a routine, as this is what your child is used to at school. For example, eat breakfast at the same time each morning and make sure they are dressed before starting the 'school' day
- Make time for exercise and breaks throughout the day to keep your child active
