Thankyou to all parents for your support with this and also well done children for another hard working week! To ensure the smooth running of this process, please can I remind parents of / request the following;

- Please ensure your child is up, dressed, has had breakfast and is ready to start the zoom lessons promptly.
- Please try to avoid disrupting the lessons by talking over the teacher or talking / making noise in the back ground.
- It would be helpful if the children have a dedicated space at home for their school work to avoid items being lost and time being wasted looking for sheets, pencils etc.
- We are required to keep attendance registers for those children attending school and registers of children's attendance at the zoom lessons. Please continue to inform school of reasons for absence if we are expecting your child in school and if your child is going to miss a zoom lesson, please advise the teacher in advance via email.
- Usually, (when it doesn't snow!), workbooks should be returned to the shed between 4pm on Thursdays and 8.30am on Fridays for marking. The marked books can be collected over the weekend after 5pm on Friday and will be needed for the following week's work.
- If your child is in school some days and at home other days, please ensure they bring their workbooks to school with them.
- PE kits are needed for those in school on Fridays.
